IMPORTANT: Barton / Mill Hill Quarry – revised application

The Applicant has now produced a revised application to the Planning Application for a quarry between Barton and Clifton which can be viewed on the County Council website.

Barton Parish Council along with Thrumpton, Gotham, Kingston and Ratcliffe as well as Clifton Village and Lark Hill believe that little of significance has changed in the latest proposals and continue to **OBJECT.**

REMEMBER: THIS AFFECTS THE WHOLE VILLAGE!

If Planning Permission is given:

- The County Council is likely to approve future extensions which would surround the whole village right round to Thrumpton.
- Sand and gravel quarrying will last for up to 12 years.
- Extraction will take place **11 hours a day and 6 days a week** mainly in the summer months with the inevitable dust and noise.
- If you own your house, the price will fall and may not be saleable.
- Our countryside will be changed forever. Brandshill Ancient Woodland, Attenborough Nature Reserve and Holme Pit and birds and wildlife will be impacted.
- The peace and quiet of the whole valley used by walkers and horse riders permanently damaged.
- 29,000 extra lorry movements per year clogging local roads.

We are therefore asking **every** resident, their family and friends to continue to **OBJECT** to the amended Planning Application

The timing of the consultation stage on this revised application has not yet been confirmed, but we will be issuing a further newsletter with details on how to object early in the New Year plan to hold an ...

Fairham Pastures – a new Parish

The 3000 houses and industrial units currently being built at Fairham are currently in the Parish of Barton in Fabis. The issues facing residents and businesses in Fairham will be very different from those of our small rural village in the Green Belt.

Rushcliffe Borough Council have now approved the principle of our proposal to create **a new Parish of Fairham**, separate from Barton in Fabis. This will leave Barton in Fabis Parish Council representing just the residents in the village including Trentside as part of the ward of Rushcliffe Borough Council including Gotham and Thrumpton. This would basically preserve the situation prior to the development at

Fairham Pastures. Rushcliffe Borough Council will need to consult the village further as part of the process and this will take place some time in 2025.

With regard to the development at Fairham Pastures itself there are people moving in and it is expected that up to 100 houses will be occupied by March. More work is taking place at the staggered junction and we are advised that all will be completed by April 2025 when the new road through the site will be opened.

Greater Nottingham Strategic Plan (GNSP)

What is it?

The Greater Nottingham Strategic Plan will contain strategic policies identifying the amount and distribution of development (and housing) and infrastructure across the whole County over the period to 2041.

That may not sound exciting, but actually has a huge impact on villages such as ours. As a Parish Council we have been working closely with the '5 Parish Group' (Barton, Thrumpton, Kingston, Ratcliffe and Gotham) to comment on the plans.

Three points are worth noting:

- Rushcliffe already has plans in place to deliver sufficient housing to meet demand with major developments at Fairham Pastures, Tollerton and Bingham. We are unlikely to see any further development on that scale even taking in to account the Government's aspiration of building 1.5 million homes over the next 5 years
- You will be aware of the plans for a Freeport including the power station site. We support the move to develop the area south of the A453 focused on advanced manufacturing (including technology needed to transition to netzero), green and low-carbon energy generation and storage. We oppose any more 'big warehouses' which employ very few people and want the area kept as green belt if the plans for advanced manufacturing on the site are not delivered.
- All the local parishes are concerned about the traffic around Junction 23 and 24 which will get worse with increased traffic from the Freeport sites at Ratcliffe and by the airport, new housing developments to the west of the airport and Fairham Pastures. We are pressing for major improvements to those junctions and a proper transport strategy.

East Midlands Airport (EMA)

We are now represented (as part of the 5 Parishes Group) on the airport's Independent Consultative Committee (ICC) and now have very useful contacts with other local interest groups with similar agendas.

The airport has now issued its new Noise Action Plan. This contains a number of actions which we will monitor carefully, including a review of (and we hope further restrictions on) training flights with proposals due in February.

Planned improvements in the village

At the meeting of the Parish Council on 10th December we agreed to spend money on a number of projects to be completed over the next few months

- Replacement of memorial trees at Little Lunnon opposite the bus shelter
- Installation of a bench at the top of New Road, together with regular grass cutting
- Repainting the phone box
- Purchase of large poppies for lamp posts for Remembrance Day 2025

If there are any other improvements you would like to propose for the village, please let one of the Parish Councillors know and we will discuss at a future meeting.

Road repairs and maintenance

As reported in the last newsletter, a number of road repairs and issues with drainage have been dealt with by the County Council following our meeting with them. A further road repair has been undertaken to the road opposite Jackie's Lane following the impact of additional heavy traffic from Kent Services yard and we will continue to monitor any future drainage and flood risks around the village.

Motorbike noise – problem eased?

Please continue to report any incidents, with registration number if possible, by ringing 101 or if there is no response via 999. The County Council is introducing a 'No Stopping' zone with cameras on the roads surrounding the Power Station to stop

the problem of car meetings in that area. This should discourage bystanders and remove the attraction of such meetings.

Messages from our Borough Councillors Andy Brown and Rex Walker

From Andy:

At the Borough Full Council meeting on 5th Dec 2024, the Council was asked to consider a petition from the Barton in Fabis residents and Parish Council requesting the removal of the Fairham development from Barton in Fabis Parish and the establishment of a new parish to represent the population of Fairham. To note the process involved for the delivery of a Community Governance Review and the proposed timetable, approve the Terms of Reference for the Community Governance Review, establish a cross-party Task and Finish Group to consider the Council's position in response to the consultation to be undertaken as part of the Review; and approve the Task and Finish Group Terms of Reference. It was voted through and the procedure if successful will take approximately two years. A motion was carried regarding car cruising meetings that are held at Ratcliffe Power Station roundabout and other locations within Rushcliffe. The motion read -:

"To write to the Home Secretary and the Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government to request that the Government instigates new legislation surrounding car cruising meetings/gatherings to implement a legal requirement for organisers to pre-notify the relevant authorities as to when and where such a meeting is planned, and that a failure to do so will result in any attendee being liable to prosecution/dispersion."

I will be holding the Mayor's Carol Service at Gotham Church on Sunday 22nd Dec, where you are welcome to join myself and other dignitaries from around the County. As Mayor this year my diary is very busy including Christmas Day, when I shall be keeping with previous Mayor's tradition with a visit to the Friary in West Bridgford and serve the homeless with Christmas lunch.

From Rex:

I have been involved with a number of planning matters through both my role as Ward Councillor and as Vice Chair of the Planning Committee. We have submitted a joint response on behalf of all 5 Parishes to the latest consultation on the Strategic Plan – which sets out policy for development in the Borough for 2041. The draft plan includes policy related to the redevelopment of the Power Station. This mirrors the permission given by the Local Development Order – which we support but would also remove the land from the Green Belt. We are arguing against this so that the land retains Green Belt protections if the stated vision for the site is not delivered. May we wish you all a merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

Message from out County Councillor Matt Barney

We have recently welcomed a new Leader at Notts County Council. Cllr Sam Smith has taken over the Leadership of the Council from Cllr Ben Bradley. I have got to

know Sam very well in recent years in his capacity as Cabinet Member for Special Education Needs. In this role he has been incredibly supportive to both me a number of local families who have faced challenges with SEND provision. I wish both Cllr Bradley and Cllr Sam Smith the very best in their new roles.

I serve on the Place Select Committee where we have recently approved plans to start the process to adopt a Nottinghamshire County Council Lane Rental Scheme. To date, such a scheme has been adopted by four other Councils in England where it has led to significant highways improvements. It enables the Council to fine contractors who do not complete works in pre-agreed timescales. Benefits of introducing such a scheme will include:

- Improved planning of the works and a reduction in the length of time sites are occupied.
- More works undertaken outside of peak times.
- The reopening of the highway during works where possible and safe to do so.
- Increase in first-time reinstatement (rather than a temporary reinstatement and a further visit) and the completion to standards and specification.
- Increased promoter collaboration for joint and continuous work sites
- The incentivisation for new techniques and technologies to undertake works in a way that minimises inconvenience to road users.

The council will now seek approval for the introduction of the Lane Rental Scheme from the Secretary of State.

In Normanton on Soar and Sutton Bonington, we are a likely to see four years of disruption as Network Rail undertake significant works to both electrify the Midland Main Lane and also to rebuild the stone wall that has collapsed on Marle Pit Hill in Sutton Bonington. A number of bridges, including Marle Pit Hill as you enter Sutton Bonington and the bridge on the A6006 at the Hathernware Estate will be demolished and rebuilt. To wall rebuilding works will commence in Jan 2005 and are due to complete by Easter. During this period, Sutton Bonington will only be accessible from the A6006 on to Park Lane.

It's been a huge privilege to serve our community in the last 12 months. I would like to take the opportunity to wish you all a very happy and peaceful Christmas.
