

Barton / Mill Hill Quarry – Important Update

We have been very surprised that the **County Council has issued a second Regulation 25 Request for Information (RFI)**. The Council had indicated after the previous (withdrawn) application, which was itself subject to 3 Regulation 25 RFIs, that they would not go down the route of multiple RFIs and opportunities for the applicant to attempt to correct deficiencies. This will require a further round of consultation with all the consultees including ourselves once the further information from the applicant is received.
